The Board meeting was opened at 7:02pm and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Privilege of the Floor: Was opened at 7:02

Cheryl Edwards wanted the Board to be aware that there is an Air B&B in operation at 20 Ferguson Rd. that even though she liked the owner, he has moved and the renters have been having loud pool parties every weekend. This is disturbing to her and other neighbors (Eleanor Weldon) is across the street. They wanted to know if there is any legislation in the Village. The Board informed them that they are discussing new local laws but nothing has been approved as of today. They will continue working on this.

Officers Dana Smith, Pat Kimmich and Ron Lower address the Board with their concerns regarding seniority and shift rotation. Officer Smith would like the present DPBA agreement (which expires May 31, 2024) to be changed so that officers can bid the same shift if they choose unlike the present contract. Because there are only 2 full time officers this could mean that the senior officer could always work one shift (ex. Days) and the newer officer always nights. Officer Kimmich (the newest full time Officer) expressed his displeasure in working only nights. He most likely would not stay with the Village Police Department if this occurred. All three officers felt that Sgt. DeCoursey's new hours were a problem as they change the full-time rotation from 3 officers to 2 officers. Should the Board decide that Sgt. DeCoursey have to be in the rotation, then the 2 senior officers would most likely bid days every other shift change and Officer Kimmich or any new officer would still most likely be on straight night shift. Per the Village Labor Attorney, this will be addressed in the new contract negotiations.

Monthly Reports:

Camden Group-written Report- the report was emailed and it was sent to all Board members,

Code Enforcement- the report was emailed and it was sent to all Board members

Supervisor's Reports:

DPW- Assistant Superintendent Caleb Bean reported that "Second Wind Cottages" water service has been tapped. Will working there they discovered a very large dead pine tree that needed to come down. Trustee Wakeman would like to see a list of target trees. Other work that has been completed: paving on Ferguson and Lake St., the new fence at Village Hall has been installed, Mums were planted around the Village, Helped install file cabinets in the storage trailer, helped with the installation of the concrete planter/barriers on the south side of Village Hall, and the Fountain has been shut down for winter.

Police Dept. – Chief Tagliavento gave a camera update; all cameras have been installed except the south side parking lot camera. They are waiting on NYSEG to get power to the poles to complete the hookup. Sunday is First Responders day at Montgomery Park. He has been submitting applications for grants. Fire Arms training will be starting and November 8-9 is Taser instruction training in Amhurst, NY that he and Sgt. DeCoursey are planning on attending. He reports that he finished getting all the police files organized at the Storage unit. Thre was a grease fire reported at Poets Landing that brought attention to the fire department and code enforcement regarding fire extinguishers. He also reports that there will be reality base training in December at TC3, 3 8-hour days. Trustee Sinclair asked about sending the Board the Body camera policy so they can review and vote on it at the October meeting.
