

New Emergency Siren:

The Village of Dryden has a new emergency siren! You may have noticed the siren sound for testing on Saturdays at noon, or you may have seen flyers around the village with the following information:

PUBLIC NOTICE ATTENTION: Village and Town of Dryden Residents

Village Emergency Siren

The Village has installed a new emergency notification siren for your continued safety.

The siren will sound for each of the following events:

Fire: Six seconds on - three seconds off. Repeated three times. Notification for first responders.

Severe weather: Three minute steady tone. Seek shelter immediately.

Dam failure: Fifteen seconds on - fifteen seconds off repeated for three minutes. Evacuate to higher ground immediately.

If you hear the siren, do not call 911. Instead, tune to your local radio/TV station, or the National Weather Service for updates.

The Village of Dryden website (www.dryden-ny.org) has more information. Know what to do before an emergency.

The emergency notification siren will also be tested every Saturday at 12:00 noon.

Emergency Siren Testing: On Thursday, November 16th at 12:00 noon, the village emergency siren will be tested and all the different signals will sound. **Please do not call 911 as this is only a test.**
